Faith is More Than Just Belief

Intro:

- 1. The Philippian Jailer was told to <u>believe in the Lord Jesus</u>, and you will be saved you and your household. Act 16:31.
 - a. Is this "belief", as we know it today, or is there more to it?
 - b. The Great Encyclopedia Dictionary = to accept as true or real, acceptance of the truth or reality of anything without certain proof.
- 2. Is this faith God wants you to have simply the acceptance of stuff?
 - a. Example: I believe God exists up there someplace.
 - b. Example: Jesus died on the cross for us & He was resurrected from the dead.
- 3. What is it about belief that makes it the faith God wants you to have?

John 4:46-54

I. v46-49 - Belief was Expressed in What Lord Jesus Could Do

- A. Who was this person?
 - Royal Official (η̂ν τις βασιλικὸς) = lit. a person associated with a king. He was probably from King Herod's court.
 - 2. Although similar, it is probably a different event from the healing of the Centurion's servant found in Matt 8:5-13 & Lk 7:1-10.
- B. What did he need?
 - 1. The Lord's ability as a miracle worker.
 - 2. v46 His son was badly sick (ἀσθενέω) = feeble, too weak to get out of bed.
 - 3. v47 His son was close to death.
 - 4. He really believed the Lord could heal his son!
- C. The Lord was not happy with this type of belief alone! He said Unless you people see miraculous signs and wonders you will never believe. v48.
 - The faith God is looking for is more than simply believing some truths about the Lord! Jn 2:23-25 - Now while he was in Jerusalem at the Passover Feast, <u>many</u> <u>people saw the miraculous signs he was doing and believed in his name</u>. But Jesus would not entrust himself to them, for he knew all men. He did not need man's testimony about man, for he knew what was in a man.
 - 2. In order to have a personal relationship with the Lord, or anyone else, more than just intellectual belief is necessary!
 - II. v50-53 Belief was Expressed in What Lord Jesus Said
- A. Jesus said, "You may go. Your son will live." The man took Jesus at his word and departed. v50.
 - 1. This person believed that if Jesus said it that was good enough!
- 2. v51-53 But this was not just a blind faith he still asked his servants to confirm it! B. How do you begin developing the faith God is looking for?
 - 1. Hear & study the word of God. Rom 10:17 Consequently, <u>faith comes from hearing</u> the message, and <u>the message is heard through the word of Christ</u>.
 - 2. Accept & obey God's word. Jam 1:22 Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.
 - Develop the conviction that the word of God is true without needing certainty. Heb 11:1 - Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.
 - 4. Again in order to have a personal relationship with the Lord, or anyone else, more than just intellectual belief is necessary!

III. Faith is a Commitment to Who Lord Jesus Really Is!

- A. Who is Lord Jesus really?
 - 1. Jesus asked His disciples, Who do people say the Son of Man is? Matt 16:13
 - 2. Peter responded with the correct answer, You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. Matt 16:16.
- B. What were the implications of the servants' answer when the royal official asked about the timing of this healing? v52-53
 - 1. Capernaum was about 20 miles from Cana a good day's journey when walking.
 - a. So the healing was long distance. Jesus didn't have to be present for it to happen.
 - b. God is omnipresent everywhere at the same time!
 - 2. The healing was instantaneous. God is omnipotent all powerful!
 - 3. He realized that only God could do these things!
 - 4. This statement means that Jesus was God Himself revealed in human terms that you & I could understand & appreciate!
 - a. Christmas celebrates this fact the Incarnation.
 - b. It's upon the Good Confession, Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God (Matt 16:16) & Jesus is Lord of your life (Rom 10:9) that you can be baptized!
- C. So the faith God is looking for establishes a relationship with the Lord as a person!
 - 1. Does this mean your faith has to reach a certain maturity before the Lord will take you to heaven?
 - a. No. The thief on the cross simply called out in desperation! (Lk 23:42-43)
 - b. God takes you right where your faith is!
 - c. But He wants to begin molding you into His image! (Col 3:9-10)
 - d. Your life is in the process of faith development!
 - 2. So the questions you should be asking yourself become:
 - a. Have you come to know the Lord through the study of His word?
 - b. Have you come to know the Lord through living His lifestyle in person?
 - c. Have you come to trust the Lord with your life?

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
