Temptations - Satan's Flaming Arrows

Intro: Take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one (Ephesians 6:16).

James 1:2-18

I. Where Do Temptations Come From? - v13-18

- A. v13-15 Satan produces temptations.
 - 1. Temptation (π ειράζω) = a test, a thought designed to produce evil action.
 - a. v13 says that God doesn't produce that!
 - b. Job's trials were given by Satan but limited by God (Job 1 & 2)
 - c. The temptations of Jesus came straight from the devil (Matthew 4:1-11)
 - 2. v14 But Satan uses your own attitudes as ammunition against you.
 - a. Evil desire (ἐπιθῦμία) = lust.
 - b. Dragged away (ἐξέλκω) = lured, to draw out by beating the brush (hunters).
 - c. Enticed (δελεάζω) = to lure with bait (fishermen).
 - 3. v15 When these thoughts persist, they produce bad conduct.
 - 4. As this sin continues, it produces death. Rom 6:23 For the wages of sin is death.
- B. God doesn't provide temptations. He motivates us by His kindness (Rom 2:4).
 - 1. Good certainly isn't provided by Satan. ILL: The Unpardonable Sin (Matt 12:22-32)
 - 2. v17 Rather, God is the provider of every good & perfect gift.
 - 3. v18 God's goal is to use His Word to produce us as the first fruit of His creatures!

II. How are You to React to Temptation When It Comes? - v2-12

- A. v2 You are to consider it pure joy!
 - 1. v3 Because the testing of your faith produces perseverance. ILL: The iron bar: worth \$2.50; as a horseshoe: \$5.00; as needles: \$175.00: as a knife blade: \$1625.00; as watchsprings: \$125,000.00!
 - 2. v4 Because when perseverance matures, the result is a complete Christian who lacks nothing in his faith!
- B. How can temptation be transformed into this blessing?
 - 1. v5-8 Through prayer.
 - a. God gives liberally to those who pray. Consider Solomon.
 - b. But effective prayer must be trusting prayer!
 - 2. v9-11 Through being content with where the Lord has you right now.
 - a. Proverbs 15:16 Better a little with the fear of the LORD than great wealth with turmoil.
 - b. John the Baptist told the Roman soldiers to be content with their pay. (Lk 3:14)
 - c. Paul learned to be content in whatever circumstances he was in (Phil 4:11).
 - d. Hebrews 13:5 tells us to be content with what we have!
 - e. So accept the testing with joy, whether through temptation or affliction, with grace & discernment.
 - 3. v12 Through the hope that when you endure the testing you will be rewarded. ILL: Diamonds are burnished for months with diamond dust before they are fit to be jewels for a crown.
