How to Make God's Priority Your Priority

James 4:13-5:6

Intro:

- 1. We all have our priorities in life: our families, our jobs, our possessions, our money, entertainment, sports or hobbies.
- 2. But God redeemed you so that He could be first in your life. You know that is true!
- 3. v17 says Anyone, then, who knows the good he ought to do and doesn't do it, sins.
- 4. So if you know what to do put God first in your life but fail to do it, it is sin!
- 5. Let's look at two activities in our lives that are often top priorities but shouldn't be.

I. 4:13-17 - Consider the Sin of Putting Your Employment Before God

- A. Examine this statement: "I have all the time in the world to plan my business or employment, make long time goals & set up objectives for my life".
 - 1. There's nothing wrong with what I just said as long as it doesn't become the # 1 priority in your life.
 - 2. Good stewardship involves good planning! God wants you to do that.
- B. v14 But you are not in control!
 - 1. You don't have the final say about finding a job, staying employed, where you will live or how much of a salary you will make.
 - 2. You're not in control of your time. You may be living as though the Lord will never come again time will continue on indefinitely.
 - 3. You are not in control of your lifespan. You may be living as though you are certain you will be alive until you're at least 85!
 - 4. ILL: Parable of the Rich Fool (Lk 12:16-21).
 - 5. ILL: My plans to settle in San Diego.
 - 6. Someone coined this popular phrase: "You want to make God laugh tell Him your plans!"
- C. v15 Therefore use the time you have to do whatever is in the scope of the Lord's will.
 - 1. A carpenter once said, "I am employed by God. I simply make cabinets to put food on the table".
 - 2. If your life belongs to God use it for Him!
 - 3. v16 Whenever you boast about your accomplishments, your successes or your career, it is evil.

II. 5:1-6 - Consider the Sin of Putting Your Possessions Before God

- A. Examine this statement: "Since I have a lot of money & possessions, I am rich!"
 - 1. On April 25, 1972 in Barcelona, Spain, the British actor, George Sanders, committed suicide. The note said, "It's because I'm bored!"
 - 2. You are not rich because you have money, influence & possessions you are rich when you are committed to God's will for your life!
- B. v2-3 But you are not in control.
 - 1. You can have crops but they can rot. ILL: Citrus trees freezing in CA & FL.
 - 2. You can have money but it can be eaten away.
 - 3. v3 (Living Bible) The value of your gold & silver is dropping fast . . . Could this be inflation?
 - 4. Your money can be a witness against you! ILL: The Rich Man & Lazarus (Lk 16:19-31).
 - 5. You can be so focused on yourself that you become insensitive to others.
 - a. v4 You may cheat, lie or step on others to get to the top.
 - b. You may just forget about the needs of others.
 - c. ILL: Parable of the Judgment Scene (Matt 25:31-46).
 - 6. v5 You can get so wrapped up in the pleasures that possessions bring that you fatten yourself up in the day of slaughter. ILL: The farmer dropping beans along the path in front of the pigs.

- C. Therefore if your possessions stand in your way:
 - 1. Remember what the Lord said to the Rich Young Ruler, Go, sell your possessions & give to the poor, & you will have treasure in heaven (Matt 19:21).
 - 2. Then you will be free to seek first His kingdom & His righteousness; & all these things shall be added to you (Matt 6:33).

ILL: "Let Go and Find Out". You might need to LET GO of your own goals so that God can fulfill His purpose for your life!
